

Oregon Saves Retirement Savings Program

The first program of its kind in the nation, the OregonSaves program is an easy, automatic way for Oregon workers to save for retirement at work. Employees don't need to do anything to enroll. Contributions are made through payroll deductions into an individual retirement account (IRA) that follows the saver throughout their career.

Local Small Business Repair Grants available

The Local Small Business Repair Grants are one-time emergency funds that use existing tax increment funding (TIF) resources and funding allocated by City Council to provide support of up to \$10,000 to local small businesses needing immediate repairs. Grants are available throughout the city where businesses have sustained physical damage – such as broken windows or doors, graffiti, or sign damage – since March 8, 2020. 


