#### **Meeting Recap**

### May

May meeting conducted at Portland Kettle Works

Guest Speaker:

Jacob Falkinburg, McKenzie Malone from Venture Portland

Discussion:

In 2011 Venture Portland (previously Alliance of Portland Neighborhood Business Associations) continued the process of working with volunteer associations. Communications Director **Jacob Falkinburg** shared that there are roughly 97neighborhood associations and 30-35 active Business Districts. Jacob talked about the services offered by Venture Portland. **McKenzie** talked about the New Events Hub-McKenzie Malone's responsibility. Launched February 2021, Provides support for events, and about Member Meetups.

Thad Fisco shared some details that he has learned about Portland Police.

Our district gets 50 hours per week of policing and those hours are daylight and weekdays. According to Sargent Kelly there are currently no more than 100 officers actively on the streets. And during the late night/early morning hours that drops down to 10. The department has hired approximately 300 people that are awaiting training to allow them to be on patrol.

Thad suggested that we bring together the 35 business district leaders and board members with Venture Portland's assistance for an informal meet and greet. The purpose of the meeting, apart from meeting other district leaders, would be to agree and report to the city what businesses in Portland really need. What are businesses' top priorities?

Thad also encouraged NIBA to think about what values the MP2H streetcar might bring to our district.

## **MP2H streetcar Updates**

On May 11, 2023 NIBA held their monthly meeting at Portland Kettle Works. In anticipation of our June meeting which will include an update from Barry Manning (BPS), we discussed the MP2H streetcar issue. We have not heard any updates recently and are looking forward to what Barry will have to share on June 8, 2023. The general feeling is that the streetcar is being used as a vehicle to change zoning in the neighborhood including the Guilds Lake Industrial Sanctuary. The consensus of the group is that a plan should be developed for the area as a whole and that once that is done a study of whether the streetcar makes sense would follow. NIBA continues to meet with the Portland City Council Commissioners to discuss this issue and get their feedback.




