For those who missed Aprils meeting, we had Reid Kerr from Eschelon Security present their methodology behind private sector patrolling. Unlike traditional security companies, they receive grant funding to help place homeless in temporary and sometimes permanent housing. They stress their ability to communicate with people on the street and effectively get them to move. Their program has been successful as of late and they have been hired on by the Pearl District HOA, Clean & Safe downtown and are now patrolling Old Town and parts of the NW Industrial District.




